Here is an example of what we think is important to tell people at the event. You can say it whatever way you want. This is told to the guests in small groups before they enter the party. We know it can be hard to talk about this to people who want to party, just try your best.

You do not have to get into a big debate with party goers about principles and you can ask the awareness team for support...If someone does not take it seriously (making fun of the safer space policy, etc.), this is the time to tell them to go party somewhere else.

Hi - welcome to the party!

(Explain that it's a self-organized, non-commercial soliparty, the party concept, what it is in support of?)

We are here to have a nice time together. We are trying to make this a safer space. We will not tolerate racist, homo- and transaggressive, ableist, sexist or any other discriminatory behaviour. People who do not respect this will be asked to leave the party.

Be aware of other people's boundaries. Ask for consent before touching someone. CONSENT is cool!

If someone doesn't want to talk to you, dance with you or doesn't want to kiss you, you must accept that. No means no!

(Introduce the New Yorck event space; where the awareness table is, the quiet space, smoking rooms)

The Awareness Team are sitting at the table on the left after you enter. If you feel uncomfortable or something happens and you need support you can go to them. It does not need to be a big issue to come to talk to them. They are prepared to take your concerns seriously.

Behind the awareness table there is a private room kept for people who need some peace or to discuss an issue related to safety.

Some of the awareness team (wearing pink patches) are in the party rooms.

Smoking and non-smoking rooms are marked. Please smoke ONLY in smoking rooms.

Everyone is responsible for the atmosphere. If you witness a problematic situation, ask the affected person if they need support.

There is an awareness phone number on the flyer.
